certain hardware and software, with minimum infrastructure requirements.

Computers/Laptops

OPACs can also be installed for users to access. These systems when on network, provide access to OPAC in campus and if OPAC hosted online can be accessed through Internet. Majority of libraries are automated.

E-readers

E-readers are portable, low-power, high-resolution devices specifically designed to display digital versions of written material from books, magazines, newspapers, and other printed sources. Some e-readers also provide access to electronic documents like blogs, websites, news feeds, and the like [2].

The University of Birmingham now provides access to many eBooks [4].

Not all pages of our normal website are suitable for mobile applications [9].

Ebscohost Mobile gives access to several databases, such as Psyc INFO, ERIC and Academic Search Premier. Ebscohost Mobile is a web app [10].

Google Books is Google's project to make every book findable, searchable and, where possible, accessible online through digitisation. The Google Books Mobile site is a web app [11].

JSTOR: Ejournal portal which contains the full text of over a thousand academic journals. The JSTOR app is a web app. Students and staff of Leiden University can access the full text versions of the articles found in this database outside the university network as well, through their ULCN account [12].

Electronic Apps for Libraries

Apps, or native applications, are small programmers for smart phones. They allow you to check your email, Twitter, and Face book, surf the web, listen to music etc. There are various apps or applications developed for libraries.

Library books can be easily shelved with ShelvAR. ShelvAR is a augmented reality program that can read all the call numbers, and can determine if they are in the proper order. It is being developed by a team of researchers at Miami University's Augmented Reality Research Group [13].
